Possible Locations:

Flagpole

Thank you, God, for America. Thank you that we live in a country where we can worship You freely. Help us keep America strong by loving and obeying you. Protect and lead the men and women who serve this country. We know our citizenship is in heaven. And we can't wait to see Jesus.

School Offices
